Executive Director Update:

- Director Doyle, on target budget wise. Will work on putting a budget variance together after first quarter is closes, end of April.
- The Website Committee met and narrowed down ideas for the website update/refresh. The committee chose to stay with I-Evolve for the following reasons; they currently handle our website easy transition to upgrade, good working relationship, and had lowest bid for everything requested. Sean contacted the Town of Hamburg IT department to have the Town's website changed to redirect those looking for Economic Development to the HIDA website. It is not currently set up as such and this would beneficial for those looking for economic development and get more traffic to HIDA website. The committee will meet again as the redesign moves forward. Currently the project is under budget (\$7k budgeted, \$5,383 cost of proposal accepted). The proposal does not include video due to cost constraints however as we continue to move forward it can be put in in future. The major updates include, redesign, fillable application and access to available listings. It was also confirmed the site will have SSL certification.
- Nominations to SBA by the HIDA were chosen to receive the following awards; Ilio's Restaurant, Family Owned Business Award and Allstate Insurance/Kelly Zielinski, Woman Owned Business Award. They will be honored at a reception on May 6th and luncheon on May 10th. Board members are welcome to attend with Sean.
- Doyle's previous idea for market study on all available local office space in the area has changed based on colleague input to an internal (within Hamburg) study of local businesses/current PILOT recipients. The study would consist of doing a market analysis of a company's 5 year plan. The better we get to know local business and their needs the easier it would be to link them up to potential leads in the future.
- Continuing to work on Assemblyman Ryan coming to speak at a board meeting. Bob Reynolds and Jeff Brylski both spoke with him in Albany.
- IDA legislation, hot topic is the prevailing wage issue. Discussion took place by the board of the pros/cons of prevailing wage legislation. Arguments could be made for both sides of the issue. It was agreed that Masiello, Martucci and Calabrese, as lobbyists for local IDAs, need to work on "amending" the legislation so smaller business and projects under 1 million could still be feasible.
- Director Doyle stated he is involved with Supervisor Shaw and the Town's Strategic Planning Group working on a comprehensive plan for Hamburg, their current plan is 10 years old.
- Doyle gave the board an update on potential projects and leads. He also discussed the work of the "Western New York Venture Association". They are essentially a local "Shark Tank". ECC is involved and leading the directive as well as local high schools. The idea is to lure from within instead of trying to bring new companies to the area.
- Update the HDC Annual Agreement will be on the Town Board's agenda April 1st. Major changes; it's now a 2 year agreement and the new agreement contains language that would allow operating expenses to be paid from the "restricted account".

-Motion to allow Executive Director, Sean Doyle to engage in a service agreement with I-Evolve Technologies, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$5,383 to redesign website. The amount allocated in the 2019 approved budget is \$7,000. Breakdown as follows:

\$2499 for new content and user training on web platform \$1500 design and upload electronic / fillable form of HIDA application \$1000 Listing map to identify vacant / available properties in Hamburg for sale / lease \$384 SSL Certification for 2 years

Director, Doyle, gave an update on the PARIS reports which are due at the end of the month. They are 95% done. Issues with the report are related to PILOT recipients not returning the required annual survey as stated in their signed Agent Agreement with the HIDA. Suggestions were made by the board members to send certified letters, charge a fee for unreturned items, reiterate the recapture policy. All suggestions will be taken into consideration for a better survey return rate next year.

Treasurer, Bob Reynolds, went over the 2018 HIDA Audit report received from Amato Fox and pointed out the following highlights to the board:

In order for the shovel application to move forward a new archeological study needs to be done, previous study 10 years old. New study could cost upwards of \$30,000. Director, Doyle, will contact representatives in Albany to see if we can work with current study.

Brief discussion took place on pro/con of clearing land for sale at LECC.

PARIS report is completed and ready to be submitted by March 31st.

Treasurer, Bob Reynolds, reported on the 2018 Audit findings as follows:

- No transactions entered into by the corporation during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.
- There were no sensitive estimates affecting the financial statements.
- The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent and clear.
- They encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing the audit.
- There was one audit adjustment for the year ended December 31, 2018.
- The auditor noted that deposits may exceed the US FDIC insurance limit. Plarr asked if HNYLDC has collateral statements from the financial institution? Doyle will provide statements to the finance committee.
